

USDA research is working for Missouri

Supporting innovation

In FY 2015, Missouri received **\$3 million in new grants** from the Agriculture and Food Research Initiative (AFRI).

AFRI-funded researchers are studying the development pathways that control plant growth and defense in grass crops, in order to develop new grass varieties with higher stress tolerance.

Missouri State University is using an AFRI grant to develop a new Cabernet Sauvignon grape hybrid that is more resistant to the fungus that causes grape bunch rot.

Supporting small business

From 2006-2015, Missouri small businesses received more than \$3.5 million in grants through the Small Business Innovation Research program within USDA

In Kerney, **Marc IV Consulting Inc.** is using an SBIR grant to develop a system that more efficiently converts glycerol, a biodisel co-product, into glycerol carbonate, a high-value biobased material used in personal care products.

Economic Impact



In 2014, agriculture and related industries added **\$985 billion** to the U.S. gross domestic product (GDP).



Agriculture exports hit a record high of **\$150 billion**, or 9% of total U.S. exports, in 2014.



In 2014, 17.3 million full- and part-time jobs were related to agriculture – **about** 9.3% of total U.S. employment.



U.S. public investments in agriculture research and development produce benefit-cost ratios of 20:1 and higher
